4.1. Description of first aid measures

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Cover with plastic sheet to prevent spreading. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Prevent entry into waterways, sewer, basements or confined areas.
